### Jharkhand initiates High Income Natural Farming Program



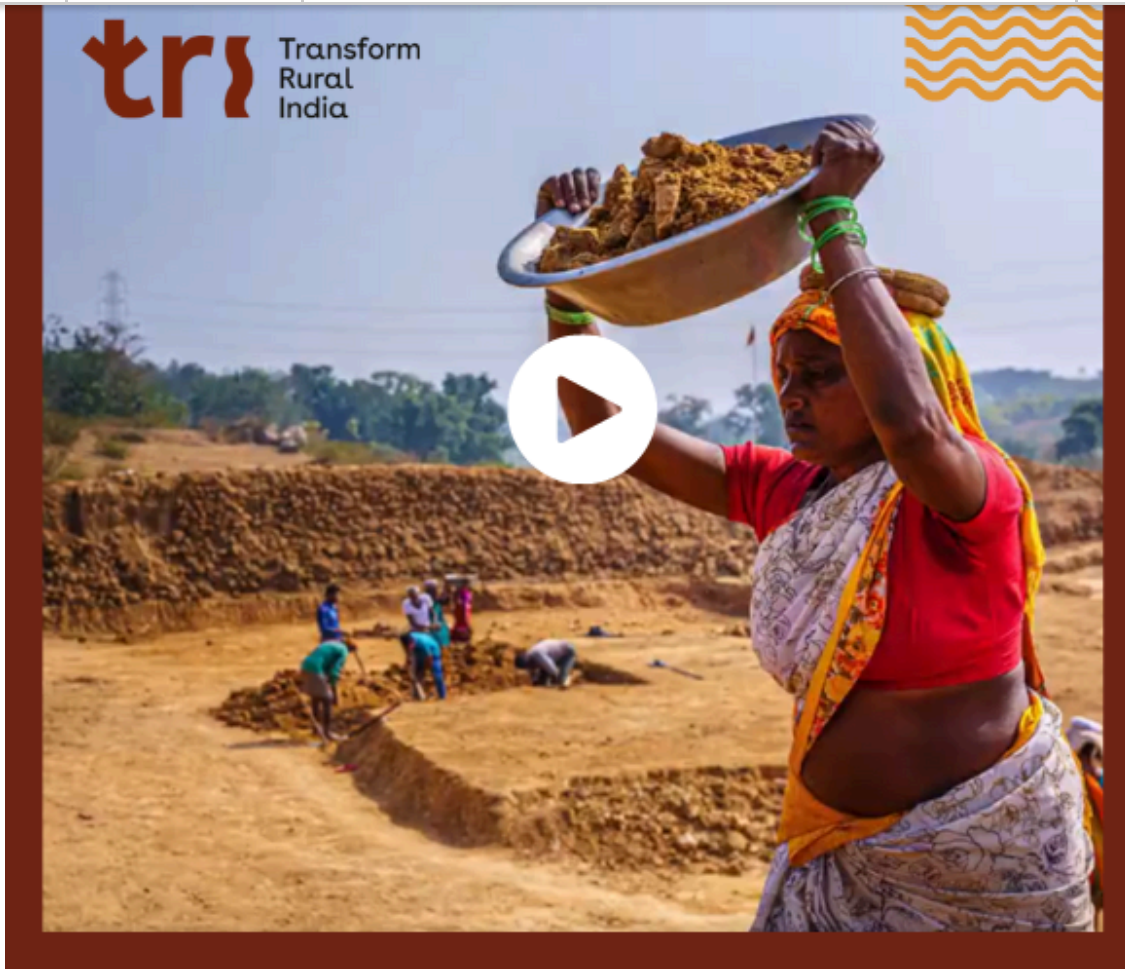

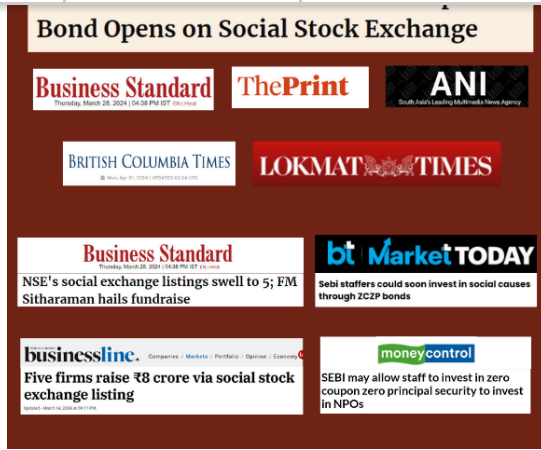
